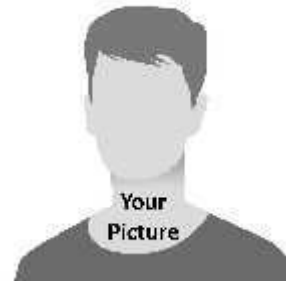
The 2001 Academy Awards
